1. **Welcome** – Natalie Dansie, Assist. Chair
2. **Review of Minutes:** Motioned to approve: Soni Hirasuna 2<sup>nd</sup>: Kelly Taoalii **The minutes were unanimously approved.**
3. **2022-2023 Land Trust Plan projected Funding and Goals**
  - a. **Review / Final Overview** – Mr. Wihongi received notification from Superintendent Covington that the amount of funds for Murray High School from Land Trust for the 2022-2023 school year will be \$229,848. That is an increase of approximately \$1,000 over the current year, and is a bit lower than expected. The council reviewed the goals and projected funding for next year, noting that the majority of the funding is spent on reducing class sizes and offering classes that would not be available without that funding such as AP and honors classes.
  - b. **Funding Items Motion to Approve** – Motioned by: Stacey Murdoch 2<sup>nd</sup>: Cheree Larson and **unanimously approved.**
  - c. **Electronic signature sent out to SCC to confirm input into Land Trust plan** – Council members should watch for an email requesting their electronic signature to confirm their approval of the 2022-2023 Land Trust Plan.
  - d. **Final plan submitted to Superintendent and MCSD board by March 25th** – The final approved plan will be sent to Superintendent Covington to be presented to the Murray Board of Education for 2 readings in their April and May meetings.
4. **Counseling/Principal Corner**
  - a. **College Day Report** – College day was last week at MHS and it went well. 11<sup>th</sup> grade students had the opportunity to attend sessions with representatives of 3 different colleges of their choice.  
MHS also recently had a Registration Fair that was well attended by 9<sup>th</sup> grade students, but not as much by current 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students. An idea was shared for next year of perhaps having a mini registration fair during the school day lunch hour to focus on AP and Concurrent Enrollment class opportunities and focus on reaching 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students that way.
  - b. **Upcoming State Assessments** – The Jr. ACT Day will be on March 8, 2022. 11<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the ACT at the school that day. 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students will not come to the school, but have the opportunity to work online on Canvas. It will be a NONA/B day.  
The Sophomore Aspire Plus testing will be on April 14, 2022. Only 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will come to school that day. It will also be a NONA/B day.
  - c. **Staffing needs at MHS for 22-23** – At this time, the new hire needs for next school year are: 3 English Teachers, a Library Media Specialist, 1 full-time Athletic Director, a School Resource Officer, and a Drill Team Coach.
