



# Citizenship Remediation

## How Can I Remove a “U”?



There are multiple ways to remediate a citizenship “U”. Talk with Adrienne Miller in the Citizenship Office for more information. Do not wait until the end of your senior year to remediate “U’s”. Student’s with outstanding U’s may not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony.

The best way to remediate a “U” is to not earn them. Make sure you have no unexcused absences or tardies. Attend class regularly and have parents excuse absences when you do miss a class.

## Options for “U” Remediation

### Improve Grades

Improve your GPA by .50 from the previous term and all “U’s” from the previous term will be remediated

Improve your GPA by 1.0 from the previous term and all “U’s” from the previous two terms will be remediated

### Improve Citizenship

Earn all “S” citizenship grades in any given term and remediate all “U’s” from the previous term

### Complete Credit Recovery

Complete an accredited credit recovery course and remove one “U”

One “U” per .25 credits recovered

### Attend Morning Detention

Attend 2 morning detention sessions to remediate 1 “U”

\*Detention offered during the last 3 weeks of the quarter

\*\*No afternoon detention

### Complete Canvas Modules

Complete 4 Canvas modules to remediate 1 “U”

### Complete Service Hours

Complete 2 hours of service outside of school hours to remediate 1 “U”. Service hours must be pre-approved by administration and monitored by a supervising adult.

### Improve Assessment Score

Re-take an assessment (during Flex) and improve your score by at least 10%. Test retakes must be pre-approved by the teacher for “U” remediation.

Only a “U” from that teacher’s class is eligible.

### Attend Approved MHS Activity

Activities, such as athletic events and art performances, will be offered throughout the year for “U” remediation. Activities must be pre-approved by administration. Student must attend the entire event and complete any required forms.

It is the responsibility of the student to initiate the remediation process and provide valid documentation.
